






# 'Medical Make Up' of the New Parliament

## GPs Elected to Parliament

		
Dr. Sarah Wollaston	Totnes Devon	Hold seat by 39% majority
<p>Dr. Wollaston became an MP in 2010 after being elected as a candidate by local voters in the UK's first 'open primary'. Since 2014 she has chaired the influential House of Commons health select committee.</p>		
Dr. Liam Fox	North Somerset	Hold seat with 39% majority
<p>Now a Backbencher, Dr. Fox has been an MP since 1992. He was Defense Secretary for a year after the last general election, and is a former shadow health secretary.</p>		
Dr. Phillip Lee	Bracknell Berkshire	Hold Seat with 39% majority
<p>Dr. Lee stood for election in Blaenau Gwent, Wales, in 2005 before winning in Bracknell in 2010. He holds a number of posts on all-party parliamentary groups.</p>		
Dr. James Davis	Vale of Clywd, Wales	Took seat from Labour with 0.7% majority
<p>A Councillor in Prestatyn for nine years, Dr Davies remains a practising GP. Born and raised locally, he has pledged to make tackling soaring unemployment his top priority.</p>
